SHAMPOO MIXTURE

			0100
Soft soap		•••	Half an ounce.
Powdered bo	orax		One drachm.
Ammonia	•••		One drachm.
Eau de Colo		•••	Half an ounce.
Soft rain-wa	ter (boil	ing)	One quart.

Instructions .- Put the soft soap, borax, ammonia into a jug; pour on a pint of boiling soft water; mix well. Use as much as required as lather for the hair. The Eau de Cologne is to preserve the mixture for future use, but is always a pleasant addition to the wash. DISPENSER.
