It is making a choice of ways and times To have in mind the mottoes, "*Festina lente*" (Make haste slowly), and "Everything comes to him who can wait," without relinquishing the object in view, is a part of honourable tact. A stranger coming to an Institution, excepting one who has received a special commission to reform "existing abuses," need not wonder if the abuses are not so apparent or so intolerable to those who are accustomed to them, and may expect to meet opposition if changes are proposed from conservatism, if from no worse motives. To energetically "wire in," as your correspondent says she did, may in many such a case defeat its own ends, and the reformer may shortly leave the scene having effected nothing and gained no credit, where better-considered and longer-continued efforts would have brought success .- I am, yours truly,
