

men; and ignorance of French is such a drawback that all who cannot *speak well* should be prepared to take lessons on arrival here. Applicants should have had at least three years' experience, occupied either in training and responsibility in good general or fever Hospitals, or in training there and in private nursing. A good knowledge of sick cookery is highly important. It is also important to be able to travel and cross the sea without discomfort, as the Nurses have frequently to convey patients. An interview with the Directress in London in the summer is needful before coming to terms. On all these points statements should be made on applying, clearly and in order, or correspondence at this distance and with such numbers of applicants becomes almost an impossibility. The agreements with this Institution vary in length from eight to three months, between October 1 and June 1. The salary is £3 a month. Outdoor and indoor uniforms are provided, with travelling and laundry expenses.—I am, Sir, faithfully yours,
