own room pretty and attractive is almost sure to be so herself, and anyone who knows much of nursing the sick will remember how patients love to have something bright and pretty to look at. I do not believe for one moment that any Nurse worthy the name would allow the comfort of her own room to keep her from her duty, however unpleasant that might be, and I think if "A Parish Priest" is ever cared for by a Nurse who banishes all pretty things from the sick room, he will not speak as he does now, and give us more unkind things to endure than we have at present. I remember reading that "Endurance is indisputably the highest form of bravery," and we often have to find it so -I am, Sir, yours truly, S. D. H.
