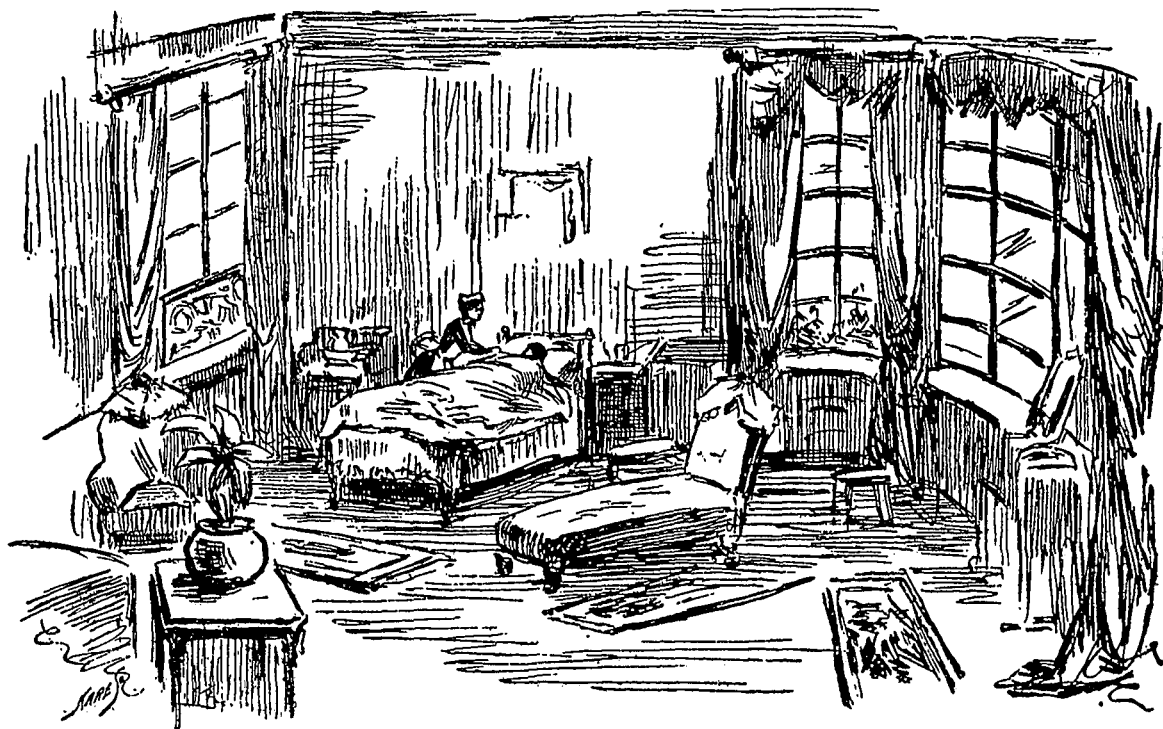
WE are glad to learn that the St. Raphael's Home, Worthing, has benefited by the following gifts during the past week:—A consignment of malt
