EDITORIAL.

A NEW MOVEMENT.

IT has, on several previous occasions, been our good fortune, as it has naturally been our desire, to be the first journal to convey to Nurses in the United Kingdom and its Colonies, news of the gravest importance to them professionally. But it is with very mingled feelings that we now draw their attention to a fact with which we have just become acquainted. We are not yet at liberty to divulge names or other particulars, which have been communicated to us in confidence, but, were we able to do so, our readers would understand at once the significance of the new movement which is now about to be initiated. We learn on very good authority that a new Society is being formed which will probably be henceforth widely known under the name of the Nursing Reform League, or by some similar appellation. Its programme is simple but comprehensive, because "Protection for the sick: Justice for Nurses," are its watchwords. It is to be composed of ladies and gentlemen—lay or professional—who are interested in Hospital affairs, and who will work as District Committees in all parts of the country. Each of these Committees will be represented by one or more of their members, upon a Central Council which will work in the Metropolis. There will be a small annual subscription to cover the necessary expenses for clerical labour, postage, and stationery, but, as nearly all the work will be done by honorary officials, it is expected that the
