Kilburn Rise .- We know of no Hospital which admits Nurses after forty years of age. Good work is to be got in some of the Home Hospitals, where your age would not be prohibitive, and in fact would be considered an advantage by the male patients. Your sister should enter a children's Hospital—the Victoria, Queen's Road, Chelsea, or Great Ormond Street, London, W.C.

Miss Quinton.-Your letter shall appear as soon as we can find space for it.

M. E. L. (Finsbury Park) .- Do not pay for your training, Nothing at present is to be gained by it. Enter a large training school as a Regular Probationer, and work for a three years' certificate. St. Bartholomew's, the Middlesex, St. George's, the Royal Free, and University College, all give excellent training.
