Rowntree by no means confine their attention to the production of chocolate and cocoa, for they have such a stock of the better kinds of confectionery as even many a French house might envy, their chocolate cream fondants containing, instead of the ordinary cream, a delicious raspberry or strawberry cream, or some other fruit, as may be preferred by the purchaser; and not alone in creams does this house excel, for fruit lozenges of almost every kind of fruit ordinarily known to

the English market, are made, embracing among the ordinary kinds such fruits as currants (black and red), raspberries, strawberries, damsons, greengage, apricot, &c., &c.; and what will, perhaps, be of more interest to our Nursing readers, a special malt lozenge is prepared, in which, although held in a state of suspense, the malt extract is as easily distinguishable as in its ordinary liquid state, and yet the lozenge is crystallised so far as its exterior is concerned, and could even be carried loose in the pocket without impairing its vitality. To those of our Nursing friends who may either have to take or administer maltine, this will doubtless prove a boon. We should have mentioned, also, that a violet fondant is kept, and crystallised violet of excellent quality, but far cheaper than any we have hitherto met, are kept also. A new exhibit, which we have not seen before at similar exhibitions, was the Greek-preserved goods of all kinds, from green oranges to loucomes, bonbons, and other luxuries so dear to the heart of the average Greek, shown
