Messrs. Grimmond, of Oxford Street, were showing a wide range of their celebrated water and other biscuits, rusks, &c.

Amongst other well-known makers of cocoa, Messrs. Root and Co. had a pretty stand, showing their well-known Cucca Cocoa, which their sample tins of attractive shape should do much to popularise.

Messrs. Collier Bros., Commercial Street, E., had also a full display of their well-known goods, which only need to be better known to be much more widely employed than they are even at present.

The Pure Water Co., of Battersea, had also a good show of their well-known Kola Champagne, Kola Tonic, Pure Distilled Water, &c.

Messrs. Dunn and Co., the well-known baking powder manufacturers, had also a prominent display both of their Baking Powder and also of

their Fruit Saline. Of both these we may write on a future occasion, when we are able to give more space.

Messrs. Brand and Co. (of Brand's Essence of Beef fame) were showing a full display of their goods, as also two new sauces, which we have not yet had time to test.
