On the one hundred and eighteenth anniversary of the Medical Society of London, writes The Times of May 4th, "Sir James Crichton Browne took as his subject the extent to which difference of sex should call for difference in education. . . . Upon the grounds of different weight, different complexity of structure, different specific gravity, and a different arrange-ment of blood-supply, Sir James arrives at the conclusion that the male and female brains are organs broadly distinguished from each other, and having, to some extent, different work to do. . . It goes without saying that a few women have possessed distinctively masculine mental endowments, and a few men distinctively feminine ones; but the government of States and the control of education are not things the conduct of which can be usefully or profitably based upon exceptions, however brilliant they may be."
