Condensed Milks have long since been acknowledged by the medical faculty as a valuable addi-



tion to infantile dietary, and in consequence are frequently prescribed in preference to the ordinary milk on account of being far more digestible for delicate children. It is not possible for every child to be brought up on its natural food, therefore it is necessary for the mother to provide a substitute; but this needs a careful selection. Invariably the uncondensed milk from the cow will be found far too rich in substance, and even if diluted with water and sugar it is not all that can be desired; besides

which, during the summer months it is constantly undergoing changes, though at first the degrees of sourness are imperceptible, so that even with the greatest care it is impossible to keep it fresh. Yet, on the other hand, the majority of the condensed milks are too sweet, which is equally injurious in its way, so that an insurmountable difficulty would arise were it not for a few of the manufacturers-prominently among which stand the "Anglo-Swiss Condensed

Milk Company," 10, Mark Lane, E.C., with their valuable "Milkmaid" brand, which is both nourishing and delicious. HARD SILVER PLATING BY THE ARCAS PROCESS. -One of the most useful and most widelyappreciated of the properties of electricity is that by which the baser metals may be coated with the more precious, and thereby, as far as usefulness is concerned, may, in some respects, almost equal the latter in value. The invention made a revolution in metal work, for although the art of silver-plating existed before the art of electrodeposition was understood, the process was costly, difficult, and very limited in its applicability, only articles of the plainest design being capable of its treatment. Electro-plating with silver held the day for a long while, and may still be said to hold it, but has found a strong rival in nickel-plating, which has the advantage of being cheaper, while its appearance is almost equally effective. Both the silver and nickel processes
