# Editorial.

THE LORDS' COMMITTEE AND THE LONDON HOSPITAL--- II.

EFORE continuing our review of the condemnatory recommendations of 6 the Select Committee of the House of Lords, with reference to the charges

advanced against the London Hospital, we must, for a moment, digress to notice a matter which has just occurred in this connection. Times without number, we have pointed out that our contemporaries were making the gravest mistake in attempting to hush up the scandals at this Institution. Again and again, we have, from the best possible evidence, asserted that the truth would inevitably come out; that the evils were too glaring, the wrong and injustice too great, for them to be permanently concealed; that a "conspiracy of silence " concerning revealed scandals would only lead the public to believe that things were even worse than they seemed to be; and that the certain result of this would be that all Hospitals would suffer in the loss of public confidence. Now we call our contemporaries to notice that our predictions have been more than fulfilled. Desperate efforts have been, and are being, made to restore public interest in Hospitals, but the Hospital Sunday Fund points, in its greatly reduced returns this year, a moral which is absolutely unmistakable. Again and again, we have said that
