The following are the rules for the competition :---

I. All dolls must be of the same size and height, and must, therefore, be obtained from a manufacturer whose address can be obtained from the undersigned.

2. The clothing must be complete, and must accurately represent the material of the uniform worn in the Hospital represented.

3. Each set must be carefully packed in a wooden box, and must be delivered at the address given below, on or before November 30th of this year.

4. Each doll must bear on a piece of paper stitched to its dress, the full name and address of its exhibitor, and the name of the Hospital whose uniform it represents.
5. The decision of the judges must be accepted as final, and cannot be questioned.
6. The results will be announced in *The Nursing Record* early in December.
