

and contains a complete set of glass for medical and surgical purposes, designed by Mrs. Bedford Fenwick, and made by Messrs. Powell, Whitefriars, London. Amongst them, I noticed special air-tight jars for sterilized dressings and cut dressings, measure jugs, lotion bowls, binding dressing bowls, instrument platters and rests, catheter bowl, surgeon's basins, plain white for sterilized water, tins trimmed with sapphire or ruby for antiseptic lotions, and most ingenious little covered jars with holes in the covers in which to place thermometers in solution between use—the white jar marked "axilla," ruby jar "rectum," blue jar "mouth." This, and kindred arrangements, shows a beauty of detail that is raising nursing from a clumsy craft into a scientific profession.
