for the year preceding and attach thereto a duly certified statement of accounts and of the finances of the Corporation.

Each Member of the Corporation shall pay such annual or other subscription as may be prescribed by the Bye-laws for the time being in force.

At every general or special Meeting of the Corporation every member of the Corporation shall have a vote but no Member shall be entitled to be present or to vote at such meeting who is in arrear of any subscription or other sum payable by him or her under the Bye-laws for the time being in force.

At any such meeting and at any meeting of any Council Committee or Sub-Committee of the Corporation the person for the time being occupying the chair shall be entitled to vote and shall also in case the numbers voting upon any question shall appear to be equal on either side be entitled to give a further or casting vote.

If any person ceases from any cause whatever to be a Member of the Corporation he or she shall not nor shall his or her representatives have any interest in or claim against the funds or property of the Corporation.

No act or thing done by the Corporation or by any Council Committee or meeting thereof shall be deemed to be invalidated by reason of the fact that a vacancy or vacancies may exist in any office or post appertaining to the said Corporation or in any Council or Committee of the Corporation at the time when such act or thing shall be done.

AND LASTLY We do by these presents for Us and Our Royal Successors grant unto the said Corporation hereby established and their successors that these Our Letters Patent or the enrolment or exemplification thereof shall be in and by all things good firm valid sufficient and effectual in the law according to the true intent and meaning thereof and shall be taken construed and judged in the most favourable and beneficial sense for the best advantage of the said Corporation and their successors as well in all Our Courts of Record as elsewhere by all and singular Judges Justices Officers Ministers and other subjects whatsoever of Us Our heirs and successors, any nonrecital mis-recital or any other omission imperfection defect matter cause or thing whatsoever to the ocntrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.
