Every sheet is ruled in headed columns to contain a full statement of income, expenses, and resulting balance for one month, one side being devoted to amounts received, the other to those expended. Thus the financial result for each month can be seen at a glance, and the trouble required in noting is merely nominal. By a simple arrangement of marks, the permissible deductions from income-tax can be stated in order on the expense page. It has often been said that medical practitioners are bad men of business, and we cannot either doubt the assertion or marvel that it should often prove to be true. Without much method and economy of time an opposite condition is altogether incompatible with the constant work, frequent worries, and innumerable interruptions of a doctor's life.
