varieties of biscuits, one being composed of gluten flour and a small proportion of powdered ginger, and the other of soya flour flavoured with carraway seeds; both contain a minimum amount of starchy matter, while saccharin has been substituted for sugar. The biscuits are very palatable and form a valuable addition to the dietary of diabetic patients.
