Branches of Trained Nursing.

This account of the Nursing calling would not be complete if it omitted to notice the various branches of work which the trained Nurse can undertake, and which may be conveniently described under the following heads:—

I.—HOSPITAL NURSING.

The trained Nurse may obtain the post of Head Nurse or Sister of wards in a General or Special Hospital; and in time may attain to the position of a Matron of such an Institution. The salaries of a Sister vary from £30 to £60 per annum, with board and lodging; of a Matron from £40 to £300 per annum, though there are probably only one or two who receive the latter amount, and the more usual average is from £80 to £100 a year. Both positions in their way entail hard work and no light responsibility. Under the same heading will fall posts connected with the Naval and Military Nursing Services for which we append the official regulations.

THE ROYAL NAVY.

Candidates must produce certificates or other satisfactory evidence of training at a large civil Hospital in the United Kingdom. The limits of age for appointment are—Head Sisters, between thirty and forty-eight; Sisters, between twenty-five and forty, and will not be retained in the Service after sixty. Pay (in addition to furnished quarters, uniform, fuel, light) for Head Sister, £40 to £160; for Sisters (in addition to a further allowance of 1s. 6d. a day in lieu of provisions, and 1s. 6d. per week for washing of personal linen), £30 to £50. No forms of application are supplied by the Admiralty; an ordinary letter to the Director-General at the above address is all that is requisite.
