Matrons.

KIMBERLEY GENERAL HOSPITAL.—A MATRON will be required for the above Hospital on the 1st of July, 1895. She must be unmarried or a widow without family, and over 30 years of age, must be able to produce evidence of administrative ability and successful experience in a similar appointment, and be qualified to superintend the nursing staff and to train probationers. There are 200 beds in the hospital, and about 40 nurses, including pupils; the average number of patients, European and native, is 180. Salary £200 (two hundred pounds) per annum, with furnished apartments, attendance, board,

and washing. One month's leave on full pay allowed annually. An allowance of £50 for passage out will be made. The engagement is to be subject to three months' notice on either side, provided that if notice be given by the matron within a year from date of commencing duties the passage money must be refunded, and that if notice be given by the Board of Management within the same period the return passage money will be paid should she return immediately. — Applications in candidate's own handwriting, addressed to the secretary, stating age and previous experience, and testimonials of recent date, will be received not later than Monday, 11th March, 1895.
