Nursing the doctors say, "You must open the windows and let in the fresh air." The patients say, "Oh, Nurse, we can-not stand those organs, and those paper boys, and watercress women. We must breathe the microbes of an unventilated room, so long as it is quiet." And what is the Nurse to do?
