CITY OF COVENTRY FEVER HOSPITAL.

The Corporation of the City of Coventry are prepared to receive applications for the post of MATRON to their Infectious Diseases Hospital.

Candidates must not exceed 45 years of age, and must produce evidence of having received a thorough training in a general hospital and in a fever hospital. They must also have some knowledge of house-keeping.

The candidate appointed will be required to enter on her duties on November 1st, and to co-operate with the Medical Superintendent in the control and instruction of the nursing staff and in the general management of the institution.

The salary will be £40 per annum, with Apartments, Board, and Washing.

HACKNEY UNION.—ASSISTANT MATRON WANTED.
