HACKNEY UNION.—STAFF NURSES Wanted.—The Guardians of this Union will at their Meeting, to be held on Wednesday, the 27th April, 1898, proceed to the election of Staff Nurses for the Infirmary.

Salary £24 per annum, to be increased £1 annually until a maximum of £30 per annum is reached, with rations (no beer), washing, lodging, and uniform clothing.

The appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Poor Law Officers' Superannuation Act, 1896, the Amendment Act, 1897, and to the approval of the Local Government Board.

Candidates must have had at least two years' experience in nursing in some public institution.

Candidates for the above appointments must be single, and must have attained the age of 21 years.

Personally canvassing the Guardians will disqualify a candidate.
