**ST. LEONARD, SHOREDITCH, INFIRMARY.** REORGANIZATION OF NURSING STAFF AND TO FILL VACANCIES.—The Guardians are about to appoint **WARD SISTERS** at their Infirmary, Hoxton Street, London, N. They also require the services of a **SUPERINTENDENT NIGHT NURSE** and of a **HOME SISTER**.
