

SUPERINTENDENT NURSE.

KETTERING UNION.—APPOINTMENT OF SUPERINTENDENT NURSE.—The Guardians of the above Union, invite applications for the Appointment of SUPERINTENDENT NURSE, at their Workhouse Infirmary, Kettering.

The appointment will be subject to the approval of the Local Government Board, and to the provisions of the Poor Law Officers' Superannuation Acts, 1896 and 1897.

Candidates must be single, or widows without encumbrance, not less than 30 years of age, and must have undergone a three years' course of instruction in the Medical and Surgical Wards of a Hospital or Infirmary, and also hold a Midwifery Certificate.
