#### SUPERINTENDENT NURSE.

ASTON UNION. — SUPERIN-TENDENT NURSE.

The Guardians of the Aston Union in vite applications for the appointment of SUPERINTENDENT NURSE at the Workhouse, Gravelly Hill, near Birmingham, in which there are at present about 400 sick poor, and 28 nurses and probationers

Candidates must be qualified for the appointment by having undergone for three years at least a course of instruction in the medical and surgical wards in any hospital or infirmary being a training school for nurses, and maintaining a resident physician or house surgeon.

The duties of the officer will be to superintend and control the nurses and probationers in the workhouse in the performance of their duties, subject, in matters of treatment of the sick, to the directions of the Medical Officer of the Workhouse, and in all other matters to the directions of the Master and Matron. She will also be required to assist in the training of probationers.

The salary will be at the rate of 660 per annum, together with furnished apartments, rations, and washing. The appointment will be subject to the provisions of the Poor Law Officers' Superannuation Acts, 1896 and 1897, and to the approval of the Local Government Board.
