HACKNEY UNION.—CHARGE
NURSE WANTED.—The Guardians
of this Union will, at their meeting, to be
held on Wednesday, the 29th day of March,
1899, proceed to the election of a Charge
Nurse for their schools at Brentwood,
Essex.

Salary, £30 per annum, to be increased
£1 annually until a maximum salary of
