ITEMS OF INTEREST TO NURSES.

AT last the long anticipated event, the meeting of the great International Congress of Women in London, is at hand, and before we go to press again we hope many of our readers will have had the pleasure of attending its meetings and social gatherings.

Owing to the great enthusiasm which this event has aroused, there are, altogether, some two thousand members of the Congress, and it has, therefore, been thought advisable to hold the Opening Public Meeting of Welcome on Monday, the 26th inst., at 2.30., at the Church House, Deans Yard, Westminster, instead of at the Westminster Town Hall as originally arranged, so as to prevent the inconvenience of overcrowding, which would otherwise have been inevitable. This augurs well for the daily attendance at the Congress.

The Handbook, which is quite a comprehensive pamphlet, can now be obtained from the office, price 6d., in which will be found the Programme for the Quinquennial Business Sessions of the International Council, and the Programme of the Congress Meetings, particulars as to Social Gatherings, Chairmen, Delegates, Speakers, and Members of Congress, and much other information of a valuable character.

An interesting little book, entitled, "Who's Who at the Congress," has also been compiled, and will be on sale, containing portraits and short biographical sketches of the work of the most eminent women at home and abroad who are with us for this happy event.

EVERV arrangement, as far as space will allow, is being made for the comfort and convenience of the members. Rest rooms will be furnished at Westminster and St. Martin's Town Halls, and Press rooms, Book rooms, an Enquiry Office, and a Post Office, will be found at Headquarters.

So many matters of interest are to be discussed simultaneously that we should advise our readers to arrange on the previous day which subject under discussion interests them most deeply, and then to make in good time for the particular Hall, in which the Session will be held.

MEETINGS which must not be missed are, of course, the Meeting of Welcome at the Church House, on Monday 26th, at 2.30 p.m., when the President, the Countess of Aberdeen, will deliver her Address of Welcome, and when fraternal greetings will be offered by the national delegates. At 9 p.m. there will be a reception of Delegates and Speakers at Stafford House.

ON Tuesday the Session on Medical Women will interest nurses, and will be held in the Council Chamber, Westminster Town Hall, at 2.30 p.m., Mrs. Garrett Anderson, M.D., presiding.
