

STAFF NURSES.

HACKNEY UNION.—STAFF NURSE WANTED.

The Guardians of this Union will, at their meeting to be held on Wednesday, the 27th September, 1899, proceed to the election of a STAFF NURSE for the Infirmary of their Schools at Brentwood, Essex.

Salary £24 per annum, rising £1 annually until a maximum of £30 per annum is reached, together with rations (no beer), washing, lodging, and uniform clothing.

The appointment will be subject to the provisions of the Poor Law Officers' Superannuation Act, 1896, the Amendment Act, 1897, and to the approval of the Local Government Board.
