starved to death in South Africa because of the quality, not the quantity, of food pitched at them by ignorant orderlies, and the filth and demoralising lack of order in the wards, and the horrible waste of good linen and stores was iniquitious. Thousands and thousands of the nation's money have been simply wasted in the wickedest way by the lack of control in the domestic departments of the military hospitals by careful and experienced women. Such mismanagement, all the result of the present "system," could quite easily be reformed-only women must do it. Yours,

training and certificate. Certificated Nurse.—We know of no Maternity Hospital which gives free training in midwifery. The course is as a rule for three months, and costs from 20 to 25 guineas. Although you are certificated as a medical and surgical nurse you must remember that as regards midwifery you rank as a pupil, whose work must be constantly supervised, Therefore, it is not only of no commercial value during the short term of training to the special hospital in which you are receiving instruction, but this institution has to maintain and pay a staff of skilled midwives to teach its pupils, as well as to board and lodge them for a period of three months.

C. T. Preston.—We should suggest that you first ascer-tain if the Private Nursing Institution you mention is under the superintendence of a trained nurse, otherwise you will
