Montreal has some fine churches—all modern—an interesting old chateau, which has just been saved from the vandal improvements by the Antiquarian Society, and various statues, fine and otherwise. It was founded by a Frenchman, Maisonneuve, in 1642, and seem to have had a tough struggle for existence in its early days. We went to see the two great hospitals of Montreal, the Royal Victoria, gorgeously situated on the slopes of Mount Royal, and the General, down in the town itself. Both are very interesting, beautifully fitted up, and full of interesting details for nurses, but I am leaving them for someone else to describe, merely mentioning how kindly we were received, and how thoroughly we were shown everything.

Our last day at Montreal was spent in a drizzle worthy of dear Old England, and it is steadily raining now as we hurry along in a remarkably luxurious car on the Grand Trunk to Toronto.
