of dust entering when the bag is closed. By an ingenious arrangement bottles of any size desired can be kept in position by an adjustable strap. The price of the bag, which opens with a square mouth, is £2 5s. Attention must be drawn also to a non air injecting, enema syringe, price 3s. 6d. This is made of the best English rubber and is attached by suction to the bottom of the vessel containing the fluid to be injected, an arrangement which has obvious advantages.

The dressing-table consists of two plate glass shelves, the space which is usually wasted between the upper and lower shelves being occupied by a copper tinned tank for holding two gallons of solution. This is conveyed to a basin by means of a pipe, the basin being filled, as desired, by pedal action. Underneath the basin is a

. pail for waste solution, so that if a surgeon is accompanied by this wagon on his rounds in a ward he -can have everything necessary conveniently placed for his use, and be provided, with the least possible trouble with fresh lotion for his, hands at each bedside.
