Progress of State Registration.

On Thursday, February 23rd, Mr. Munro Ferguson, M.P., presented the "Bill to Regulate the Qualifications of Trained Nurses, and to Provide for their Registration," promoted by the Society for the State Registration of Nurses, and it was read a first time.

A lay association for promoting the State Registration of Nurses is now being formed, in which the Marchioness of Londonderry is interesting herself. Trained nurses will warmly welcome the interest of an intelligent public in their professional organisation, realising, as they do, that the best interests of the patient and the nurse are identical.

Meetings of Protest.

On Saturday, February 25th, the Executive Committee of the League of St. John's House Nurses unanimously passed a forcible Resolution against the incorporation of the "Society for Promoting the Higher Education of Training of Nurses," to be forwarded to the Board of Trade.

A meeting of the Executive Board of the Registered Nurses' Society met on Wednesday, March 1st, "to consider a Protest to the Board of Trade" against the incorporation of the "Society for Promoting the Higher Education and Training of Nurses." A strong resolution was unanimously adopted.
