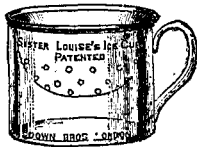


The Nursing Exhibition and Conference.

The Nursing Exhibition at St. George's Hall, Mount Street, W., organised by the Provisional Committee of the National Council of Nurses opens just as we are going to press.

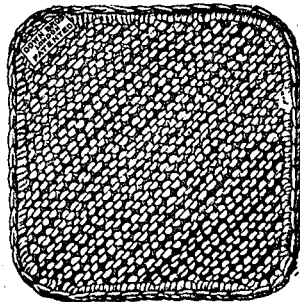

therefore only able to notice a few of the exhibits. Inside the room to the left of the door is the attractive stand of Messrs. Garrould, Edgware Road, many of whose exhibits were described in our issue last week.

On the same wall, on the other side of the fire-place is the stand of Messrs. Down Bros., of St. Thomas' Street, S.E. who are showing a variety of articles invented by nurses, including Nurse Brierley's Cleanable Earthenware Bed Pan, the Safe Surgical Sponge patented by Nurse George, and the Sister Louise Ice Cup.

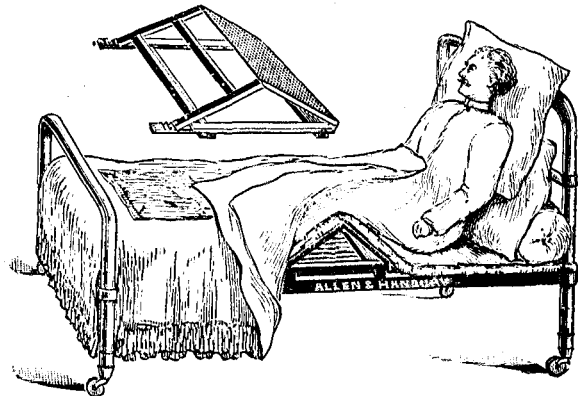


Serviette Cylinder.

Messrs. Allen and Hanburys, of Wigmore Street, to the right of the door on entering the Hall, are showing their serviette cylinder, made from Dr. Reinhardt's design, which encloses the serviette completely, and thus prevents contact with those of other patients; their milk pasteuriser, which is adapted to popular requirements, and the Sister Doris bed rest, all of which are worth noting.
