Progress of State Registration.

PETITION TO THE PRIME MINISTER.

The Representative Women's Petition sent last week to the Prime Minister, by the Society for the State Registration of Trained Nurses, respectfully and earnestly appealing to the Government to give facilities for the consideration of the Nurses' Registration Bill in the House of Commons this Session, was very influentially signed by upwards of 200 lay and professional women.

It is interesting to analyse the list of signatures, *collected in a few days*, in order to show how representative and widespread is the movement for the legal Registration of Trained Nurses. The list includes:—
