The Daily Mail printed in gold for the Coronation of King George V. and Queen Mary, given by Miss Rhoda Metherell.

The President warmly thanked Miss Bushby for her untiring zeal and all she had achieved in bringing together the very valuable Historical Collection of the College.

The Report was adopted.

THE SECRETARY'S STATEMENT.

The Secretary presented a Statement in which she reported that there had been 42 visitors to the College, and since the last Meeting of the Council French Classes had been held on November 25th, and December 2nd, 9th and 16th.

(1) (a) To consider the action of the London County Council in proposing to extend the Nurses' training from 3 to 4 years without consulting the General Nursing Council for England and Wales.

(b) To decide and take such action as may be considered advisable.

(2) To consider the action of the London County Council in deciding that applicants for Sister Housekeeper, one of the grades of Female Nursing Staff dealt with in Regulation 631, the members of which are required to be trained in Nursing and also Departmental Sisters (Massage, X-ray, and Electrical Departments) need not of necessity be State Registered Nurses, but will be specialists in their own particular branch of work.

The action (1) of the London County Council in proposing to extend the Nurses' Training from three to four years without consulting the General Nursing Council for England and Wales, was considered. After some discussion it was agreed that a letter be sent to the London County Council pointing out that in the recommendations of the Central Public Health Committee no explanation is forthcoming of what the extra training is to consist, or if the nurses are to be prepared at the end of three years to fit them to sit for the Final State Examination of the General Nursing Council as provided for in the Statutory Rules.

Also the Council considered the action of the London County Council in deciding that applicants for Sister Housekeeper, one of the grades of Female Nursing Staff dealt with in Regulation 631, the members of which are required to be trained in Nursing and also Departmental Sisters (Massage, X-ray, and Electrical Departments) need not of necessity be State Registered Nurses, but will be specialists in their own particular branch of work.

In the discussion it was pointed out that concerning "Sister Housekeeper" posts a considerable number of State Registered Sisters were taking a course of training in this branch of work at the Battersea Polytechnic, and the consequences of the recommendation of the Central Public Health Committee, that non-Registered persons shall be eligible for these well-paid posts, would deprive highly qualified Registered Nurses of their right to professional preferment.

It was agreed that a letter be sent to the London County Council taking strong exception to its decision in these matters, which would be injurious to the status of Registered Nurses, and to the standard of nursing of the sick in municipal hospitals.

CONGRATULATIONS TO MISS MACDONALD AND MISS ALLBUTT.

The President moved that a letter of congratulation be sent to Miss I. Macdonald and Miss M. G. Allbutt on their election as Directors of the National Council of Nurses of Great Britain, and expressed satisfaction that their election provided for the representation of nurses in Municipal Hospitals, and of nurses in Private practice.
