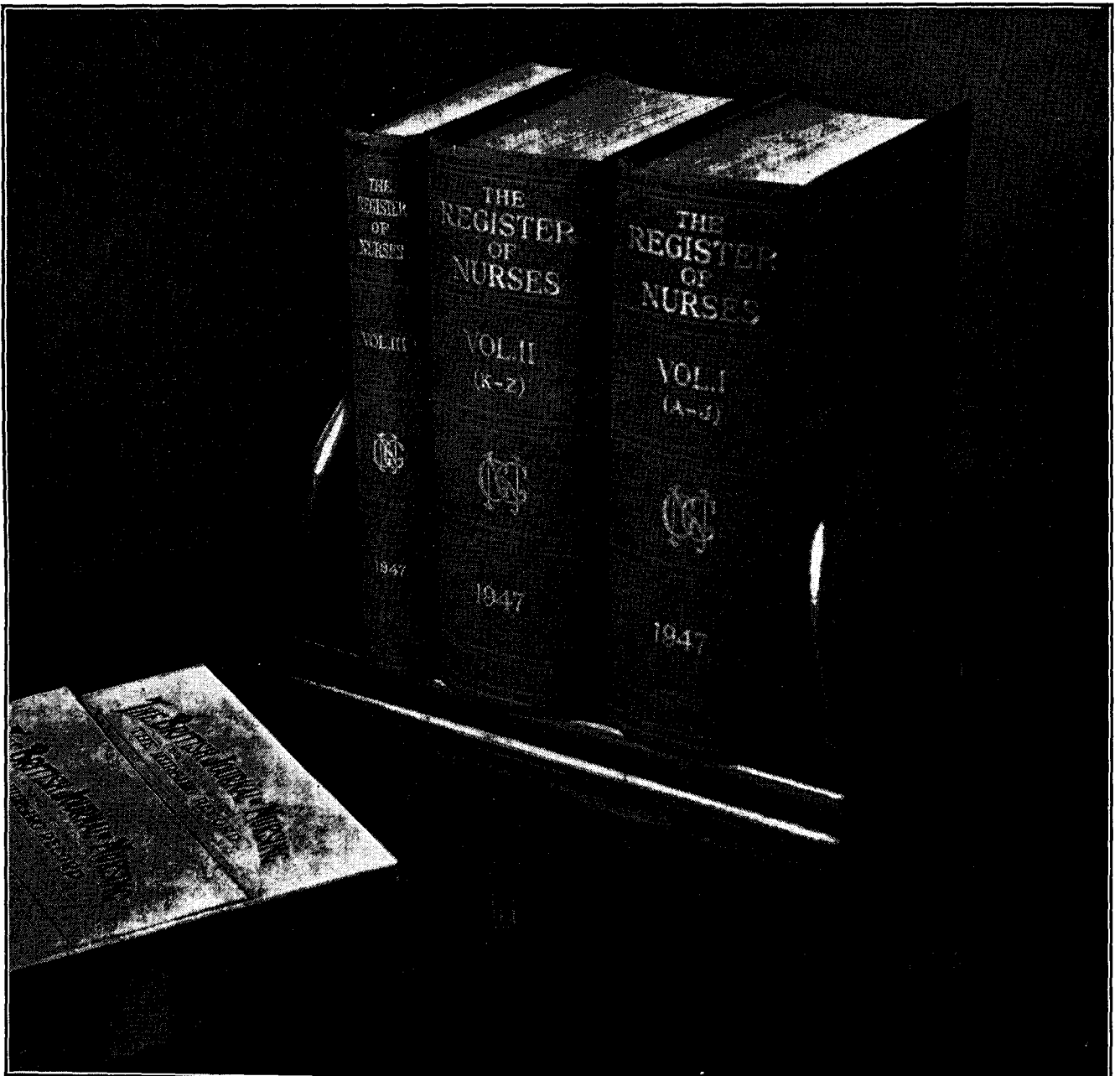
The President's Address.
