"THE Cama Hospital in Bombay was opened in August of 1886 under the care of lady doctors. It was endowed by a wealthy Parsee for the benefit of native women and children of all castes. Now that the Hospital has become well known, patients come in readily to obtain the relief they would not seek at the hands of gentlemen doctors. In Nursing the natives, we find a ready recognition of any kindness shown to them, and a very frequent way of expressing their gratitude is, on receiving their discharge from the Hospital, to bring a number of wreaths composed of white, sweet-scented flowers, one for every Doctor and Nurse. These you are supposed to wear round the neck, at any rate as long as the donor is present. This Hospital is also carrying on a great work in training native women of all castes as Nurses, with a view to their afterwards returning to their own native states and taking up work there. Two who have already left us are in charge of a small native Hospital at Baroda, and giving great satisfaction to the Doctors. They have introduced temperature charts into the Wards, and brought about many changes for the comfort of their patients. If those working in our Hospitals at home could see some of our native Nurses on their first arrival here, they would realise how marvellous is the change effected by order, method, and the example of our English Nurses."
