Miss Shea Mason.-Your letter is only one of many we have received on the same subject; we regret to say that courtesy is not always extended to the public by women in positions of authority. I feel sure you will not be subjected to rudeness under the present regime. The present official, we have reason to believe, takes a true interest in her sex and in the honourable work.

Sister Dorothy.—Communicate with Mrs. Holmes Spier, 6a Bedford Square, who is the Hon. Sec. to the Nursing Sub-Committee.

Mrs. Holmes.—The best course for your protégée to adopt would be to apply to St. Thomas's, Charing Cross, or the Westminster Hospital, as those Institutions are Training Schools which are willing to admit persons of the domestic servant class as regular Probationers. If she can read and write legibly, she would also be eligible for admission at the Royal Infirmary, Liverpool. The Staff Nurse is the Nurse in charge of a Ward, who works under the Sister, and helps to teach and supervise the Probationers.
