THE LESSONS OF A TRAGEDY.—II.

IT is an extraordinary fact that neither the Superior of the Sisterhood of St. John the Divine, nor anyone connected with the Institution, have made the slightest reply to the inquiries made by two correspondents in the *Times*, asking for explicit information concerning the training of the Nurse implicated in the Bengoe College tragedy. The matter must be cleared up, because it is far too important to the sick generally to be allowed to rest in this unsatisfactory condition. In a directory for 1892, which we have before us, we find that this Institution is situated at 68 and 70, Drayton Gardens, South Kensington; that it was founded in 1883; that its President is Earl NELSON; that its governing body is the community of St. John the Divine, whoever they may be, its Hon. Secretary, Lieut.-General J. E. T. NICHOLS, R.E., its Hon. Treasurer, HECTOR F. MUNRO, its Chaplain, the Rev. R. RHODES BRISTOW, M.A., and its Sister Superior, Miss SELINA S. WILSON.
