ward date should be thirty days from the date of submission of such application to District Head-Quarters. The following procedure has been laid down in regard to the method and time of refund of the £20 or £30 which lady Nurses enlisted in England are required to pay on retirement from the Indian Nursing Service before completion of five years' service. In order to effect the refund it will be necessary for the lady Nurse to obtain a "receivable order" from the Controller of Military Accounts of the circle in which she may be serving. The equivalent of the sterling sum to be refunded should then be paid in rupees, calculated at the official rate of exchange, into the nearest Government treasury, the receipt for the money being produced at any time before the expiration of the six months' period. In the case of a lady Nurse applying for permission to retire without giving the six months' notice, she should attach the receipt for the refund to her application. Lady Nurses enlisted in India should also follow the above procedure in refunding the amount required from them under such circumstances.
