

sion. For many reasons, it has not been expedient, and in some ways it has not been possible, to do this sooner. But now that the great initial obstacles to the scheme have been overcome, and that the system has become an accomplished fact, it will have manifest advantages that the whole history of the rise and progress of the movement should be detailed in chronological order.

The first proposal that Nurses should be registered is believed to have been made as far back as 1874. In that year, a "Hand-book for Hospital Sisters," written by Miss FLOR-ENCE LEES, was published. It was edited by Dr. (now Sir HENRY) ACLAND, who wrote a preface in which occur the following words: -" The Medical Act of 1858 allows women to be registered as medical practitioners.
