# Nursing Echoes.

THE ROYAL SANITARY INSTITUTE announces that its 1955 Health Congress, which is to be held at Bournemouth in May of next year, will for the first time include a conference of Domiciliary Nurses and Midwives.

WILLESDEN'S BOROUGH ENGINEER and Surveyor, Mr. J. C. Morris, B.Sc., A.M.I.C.E., F.R.San.I., has been appointed Chairman-Elect of the Council of the Royal Sanitary Institute. He will take up his new office in October.

Mr. Morris has been a member of the Royal Sanitary Institute since 1942, and was elected to its Council in 1948. He has been Recording Secretary of the Engineers and Surveyors Conference at the Annual Health Congress of the Royal Sanitary Institute for the past five years. He is also Chairman of the Royal Congress Committee of the Institute and, in addition, serves on the Examination, Museum, Library and Education Committees.

Mr. Morris, who has been Borough Engineer and Surveyor at Willesden since April, 1942 (having pre-viously served as Deputy there) is a native of King's Lynn, Norfolk. He was educated at King Edward VII Grammar School; the Municipal Secondary School, Nelson; and subsequently at the College of Technology, Manchester, and at the Victoria University, Manchester.

He graduated at Manchester, where he took his B.Sc. in Civil and Mechanical Engineering. He has been continuously employed in local government service since February, 1919, and before coming to Willesden, was Engineering Assistant at Rotherham, Yorks; Senior Engineering Assistant, Richmond, Surrey; and Senior Engineering Assistant, Manchester.

As Borough Engineer and Surveyor at Willesden, Mr. Morris is in control of all engineering work, including highways; architectural work, including schools; building surveying, town planning, transport, cleansing, construction and maintenance of council houses; repair of War Damaged houses and the adaptation of housing accommodation, parks, baths and wash-houses.

It is interesting to note that the Royal Sanitary Institute, which was founded in 1876 to promote the health of the people, has Her Majesty The Queen as Patron, and the Rt. Hon. Lord Percy of Newcastle as President.
