leadership of the Council from 1944, and for her term as Vice-Chairman from 1939-1943.

Miss M. J. Smyth, Vice-Chairman presented a cheque to Miss Smith on behalf of past and present Councillors with warm wishes for her future happiness, and the following resolution was passed with acclamation.

Resolution.

"That this Council places on record at its meeting today, the 22nd July, 1955, its very real appreciation of the contri-bution made by Miss Dorothy M. Smith as a member of the Council since 1938, as Vice-Chairman from 1939 to 1943, and as Chairman since 1944.

Throughout the whole of this time, and particularly during her Chairmanship, Miss Smith's deep sense of duty towards the nursing profession, her whole-hearted interest in all aspects of the work of the Council and her concern that its responsibilities should be properly fulfilled, her unhurried serenity and her humour have been in constant evidence.

The Council has been enriched by her wise, kindly and practical Chairmanship."

Finance.

On the recommendation of the Finance Committee, bills and claims submitted for payment were approved, and the sums of £19,700 for cash account, £650 for postage and £3,000 for examiners' claims were allowed. It was agreed that £131 15s. 6d be spent on re-upholstering

and re-covering chairs.
