Editorial.

THE COUP DE GRACE.

THE latest attack upon the Royal British Nurses' Association is most significant. It shows that the opponents of the Association are so sore at their thoroughly deserved defeat, that they cannot even refrain from making themselves publicly ridiculous; because it is almost impossible to conceive a more pitiable exhibition of feeble foolishness than the letter which they addressed to the *Times* and other journals last week. It plainly proves that the opponents have only now one argument left—that of reckless inaccuracy. This ruled the day at the Board of Trade. It had perforce to be kept within bounds, before the Privy Council, when a judicial inquiry was imminent, but now it is refurbished and brought forth in full force. The old and oft repeated tale about the dead-level effect of the Register; the tender solicitude for Nurses, expressed by those who are engaged in sweating them unmercifully—the scrupulous care for precedents in legislation, evinced by those whose acquaintance with legal forms of a drastic kind is certainly not so intimate as, in the opinion of many, it ought to be—where are all these arguments gone?
