## Editorial.

THE LONDON HOSPITAL AGAIN.-II.

**7HE** Committee of the London Hospital has, at length, made what it is pleased to term its "reply," and this, together with the Pall Mall Gazette's answer to it, we give in another column. We are glad to hear, from various sources, that our readers appreciate the steps which we have taken to keep them, week by week, informed of the progress of this matter. It seems probable that the action of our contemporary will prove to be much more effectual in bringing about reforms at the London Hospital than the inquiry before the Lords' Committee proved to be, for it is clear that the Pall Mall Gazette understands the great importance and strength of its case, and intends to carry it through.

It is, in the highest degree, amusing to watch the attitude of the *Hospital* upon this matter. Its Editor, in a spirit of bravado, suggested that the London papers should send in special correspondents to spend a few days in the London Hospital and report their experiences, or to use the classical phrase of our contemporary—"Burdett broached it." The *Pall Mall Gazette* had no intention, as it neatly puts it, of being "personally conducted" through a tour of
