We hope you will be able to attend the demonstrations in April, when it is intended to have various shapes of abdominal bandages, as used by the leading surgeons. Patterns may then be taken. The colotomy belt, as used by Mr. Harrison Cripps, takes some time to make, but is admirable in use, and can be easily washed by the nurse. Never tear dressings, it is a slovenly method, and therefore un-nurse-like.
