You can, however, occupy your time very profitably if you have to wait for a vacancy, first by attending the course of lectures arranged by the Royal British Nurses' Association at 17, Old Cavendish Street, W., on Elementary Anatomy and Physiology, and those on Practical Nursing (a most instructive course), delivered at the same address, by Miss Isla Stewart, Matron of St. Bartholomew's Hospital. We should also advise you to take lessons in cookery for the sick.

Miss H. M. Schooling, South Tottenham.—The pattern you allude to was designed by a St. Bartholomew's Nurse; we will try and procure it for you.


