[We feel sure that many Private Nurses would appreciate such arrangements as suggested by Miss Antrobus, but as a class, we are ever diffident of expressing an opinion. This appears to us a matter of so much importance, that we would suggest that Miss Antrobus should read a short paper on the subject before the Matrons' Council; the matter could than he dispused by the Nurses themselves questions said then be discussed by the Nurses themselves, questions asked, and suggestions made. - ED.]
