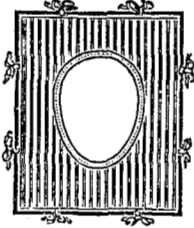


**"SANITARY PROTECTOR";**OR,

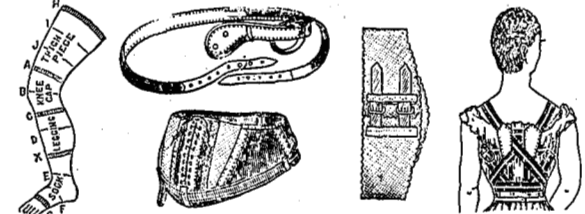
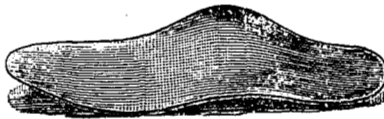
**"NON-RUN-AWAY" BANDAGE.**
