Edítorial.

LEGISLATION FOR NURSES.

'E recently reported the Resolution which Dr. Brassey Brierley had stated that it was his intention to move at the Annual Meeting of this Association, and we are glad to learn that he was sufficiently well-advised to abstain, at the last moment, from doing so. The Resolution was as follows :-

"That in the opinion of this meeting, inasmuch as Midwives or Midwifery Nurses cannot be dealt with on equal terms with other Nurses, no Bill is feasible which has for its object the registration of all Nurses, with a common standard of education, and, if it were so, is not advisable. This meeting is of opinion that the amended Bill of the Lancashire and Cheshire Branch is calculated to meet all present difficulties as far as Midwifery Nurses or Midwives are concerned, and that, as far as other Nurses go, no difficulty exists."

We are informed on good authority that if this Resolution had been proposed it would have received the most determined opposition from gentlemen who hold, on the one hand, that the British Medical Association would have been unwise to stultify itself by reversing
